- Craft a clear vision with specific, achievable, measurable goals.
- Integrate climate objectives into municipal planning.
- Raise public awareness about climate neutrality.

# 4. MECHANISMS TO REVISE AND MONITOR PROGRESS

- Conduct a thorough emissions assessment for action planning.
- Implement robust monitoring system.
- Revise and adjust the strategy based on data.
- Promote public trust with transparent reporting.
- Create channels for feedback from residents.

- Align city objectives for economic growth, social equity, and environmental sustainability.
